We refer to your information request below. Hamilton City Council provides the following response.

Your request:

Our response:

As the Rule only came into effect on 30 October, we do not yet have more detail to provide. We are required to complete this work by 1 May 2025 and are currently working updating and finalising this pending legal advice and further discussions with NZTA.
