Kia ora,

We refer to your information request below. Hamilton City Council provides the following response.

Your request:

- 1) *When did you build your first raised pedestrian crossing, and why? (As opposed to a standard zebra crossing)*
- 2) *How many have you built since?*
- 3) *In the past 5 years, how many pedestrians have been injured on traditional zebra crossings in your area?*
- 4) *In the past 5 years, how many pedestrians have been injured on raised pedestrian crossings in your area?*

Our response:

1. When did you build your first raised pedestrian crossing, and why? (As opposed to a standard zebra crossing)

In 2014/15 we converted a standard pedestrian crossing to a raised crossing outside McDonalds on Peachgrove Road due to complaints about speed in/through the shopping area. The raised crossing provides improved pedestrian safety, reduced vehicle speeds, and enhanced visibility.

2. How many have you built since?

Council has built 53 Raised Pedestrian (Zebra) Crossings in Hamilton since 2014/15.

3. In the past 5 years, how many pedestrians have been injured on traditional zebra crossings in your area?

Four pedestrians have been involved in crashes, one seriously injured, two minor injuries and one non-injury. The crossing at the location of the serious injury has since been raised and a subsequent incident resulted in one of the minor injuries below.

4. In the past 5 years, how many pedestrians have been injured on raised pedestrian crossings in your area?

Four pedestrians have been involved in a crash on a raised pedestrian crossing, two received minor injuries and two non-injury.
